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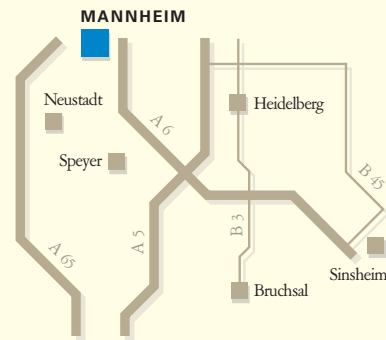

The Resplendent Residence of the Electors of the Palatinate

You cannot fail to be carried away by the baroque Palace of Mannheim. One of Europe's largest residences built during the Age of Absolutism, the construction of the palace began in 1720 after Elector Carl Philipp transferred his residence from Heidelberg to Mannheim.

40 years later, his successor Carl Theodor brought to completion this magnificent residence of monumental dimensions. During the new elector's reign Mannheim evolved into a renowned European centre of culture – a veritable “Court of Muses” at which the arts and sciences flourished. When in 1803 the Palatinate lands on the east bank of the Rhine were conferred upon the Margraviate of Baden, soon to become a much-enlarged Grand Duchy, Mannheim experienced a renewed period of prosperity.

Grand Duchess Stéphanie of Baden, Napoléon's adoptive daughter, modernised the interior of the palace primarily in accordance with the neoclassical Empire style. Mannheim remained the dowager residence of this influential princess, who maintained relations with many of the ruling houses of Europe up to her death in 1860.

The palace was almost totally destroyed during World War II, and was rebuilt in the 1960s as a centre of scientific research. Since April 2007, the historical appointments – which include 21 large-format

tapestries, valuable furniture, oil paintings, porcelain and silverware – have been presented to the public in the refurbished State Rooms of the “Beletage” (first floor).
